Elementary Summer Enrichment Classes

Adventures In Science

A fun-filled, hands on science adventure. Learn science by doing it. As Ms. Fizzle always says, "Get Messy! Take Chances! Make Connections!" all experiments and activities use common household items so budding scientists can repeat their experiments at home and demonstrate what they learned. Returning students are welcome. There are many NEW EXPERIMENTS (and a few returning favorites) planned for this summer.
